Letter from Ron Hendricks, Treasurer and Board Member of the Hearing Loss Association of America, Central Oklahoma Chapter

Dear Members and Friends of HLAA,

I am sorry to announce the loss of our beloved Hearing Helpers Demonstration Room. It was closed as of the first of June 2020.

After 22 years, Integris decided to discontinue our association for a variety of reasons, including budget concerns and COVID19. The HHR was filled with important hearing assistive technology to help those of us with hearing loss live better at home and work. Countless people visited through the years and our volunteers helped each one.

We are now looking for another major benefactor. If you know of such a possible sponsor, a beneficent corporation or individual please let us know. In the meantime we have moved all the furniture and supplies into storage. We hope it will be very short term but the monthly fee is unexpected. The monthly storage cost is \$40. We hope to restart monthly meetings in September so please stay tuned.

In other news your HLAA COC is still working to assist Oklahomans with hearing loss to live successfully in a hearing world. Our scholarship program is still in full swing. For the fifth year n a row we have awarded scholarships to Oklahoma students with hearing loss. This year we awarded three scholarships for \$1,500 each. We hope to do the same next year.

The drive to equip public gathering spaces with Hearing Loops is still on-going.

Tips for Pet Owners with Hearing Aids

To keep your hearing aids safe from pets, make sure to follow the helpful tips below:

Hearing aids emit very high frequency sounds. These are higher than what humans can hear. Cats and dogs, however, can hear it and go into "search and destroy" mode.

Make sure you remove the batteries at night.

Pets can also see hearing aids as a tasty treat or fun toy and can chew right through the device, causing permanent damage.

Make sure you store them inside a hard case or closed drawer.

The need to wear facemasks in public during the coronavirus pandemic established a new normal for people around the world. But it also created a new challenge for the hearing impaired.

During curbside treatments, Dr. Sheri Mello, an audiologist in Raleigh, North Carolina, discovered that her patients were really struggling to hear because of street noise and the face coverings of her staff.

"The covered masks cut down the volume level by 10 decibels," Mello told CNN. "And that's a lot. You're cutting a quarter of the volume."

After seeing a pattern for a face covering with a clear portion around the mouth posted in a nationwide Facebook group, Mello reached out to her clientele at Raleigh Hearing and Tinnitus Center and asked if anybody knew how to sew.

"I got 10 responses from the email blast and in just a few days I got dropped off about 30 masks," she said. "I was so impressed with that." (See complete article: www.cnn.com/2020/05/05/us/clear-face-masks-hearing-impaired-trnd/index.html)
