Speaker for the May Meeting on Zoom

Valerie Freeman, Assistant Professor, and Director of the Sociophonetics Lab at Oklahoma State University, submitted a short description of the project on which she is working. Here is her summary:

The Deaf Experience, Deaf Expression (DXDX) Project collects interviews with deaf and hard-of-hearing (DHH) people about their experiences with language, hearing, socializing, schooling, and related topics. The collection will provide parents, teachers, healthcare professionals, and the newly-diagnosed with first-hand accounts from ordinary people.

These real-life stories of challenges and advice are often missing during the diagnostic process, and they can be particularly useful for parents who must make many tough decisions for their young DHH children. We have collected over 30 interviews in speech and sign language over Zoom so far, mostly with adults who have had severe hearing loss since childhood. This school year, we are expanding to interview DHH teens, tweens, and their parents.

DXDX is a long-term project that can grow in many directions. In this talk, I will present our work and plans so far -- and ask how the project can grow to include and benefit HLAA members. My name is Andrea Craig and I am a researcher with the Department of Geography at University of Oklahoma.

I am conducting research that assesses risk communication of severe weather among the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community throughout the state of Oklahoma. I wanted to reach out and contact various people, hoping that with your connections in the OK state area, you would be willing to distribute this anonymous IRB approved survey (post on social media, word of mouth etc.), or recommend resources/groups to me to guide me in the right direction. I am hoping to gather enough data to understand severe weather perceptions among D/HoH community in OK.

The meteorological spring is upon us in Oklahoma, so the need for efficient weather communication is crucial, especially for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community who cannot always rely on auditory and oral cues to receive urgent communication.

A weather survey for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Oklahomans was created in hopes to gather data to understand how Deaf and Hard of Hearing individuals in Oklahoma perceive and receive their weather alerts. Here is a link to the survey:

HLAA Receives Permission from the FDA to Host a Meeting on Sensorineural Hearing Loss on May 25

HLAA has received permission from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to host an Externally-Led Patient-Focused Drug Development Meeting (EL-PFDD) for People and Families Living with Sensorineural Hearing Loss on Tuesday, May 25, from 10 a.m.-3 p.m., U.S. ET. This is a YouTube Live virtual meeting, and all are welcome to attend. You can pop in and out of the live meeting. The meeting will be recorded, and the recording will be available 48 hours after the meeting. This is the FIRST meeting of this kind on hearing loss that the FDA has given permission to hold.

The purpose of HLAA's Externally-Led Patient-Focused Drug Development Meeting is to hear directly from two representative panels of people with hearing loss, and people with hearing loss and their families attending remotely about the most burdensome symptoms they experience, what it is like to live with hearing loss, their assessment of treatments they are currently using, and what would they like to see in future treatments.

The voice of the person with hearing loss will be heard in order to develop therapies and devices for people with hearing loss. The meeting is open to all, but key reviewers from the FDA will be present from three divisions:

Center for Devices and Radiological Health-CDRH

Center for Drug Evaluation & Research-CDER

Center for Biologics Evaluation & Research-CBER (this includes OTAT-the Office of Tissues and Advanced Therapies)
