# Assistive Technology Tip of the Month

### What is Assistive Technology?

Assistive technology, often referred to as "AT", for people with hearing loss, refers to various devices and systems that can help people with hearing loss to communicate and function better in different settings. Some examples of assistive technology are alerting devices, apps, assistive listening devices, captioning, hearing aids, cochlear implants, and telephone devices. Assistive technology can eliminate the effects of distance, background noise, and reverberation by sending sound directly to users' ears. Some common types of assistive listening devices are FM systems, infrared systems, audio induction loop systems, and accessories that connect hearing aids to

media. Assistive technology can be personalized and tailored to the specific needs and goals of each individual with hearing loss. There are specialized centers that provide evaluation and recommendation of assistive technology for hearing impaired.

Central Oklahoma Chapter monthly meetings include AT regularly, including captions, where you can see and read what is being said, it is looped to receive sound from the microphone directly into your ear, by using the Telecoil feature in the listeners hearing aids. Come to the next meeting to see what it's all about - we would love to show you how to use these features!
