# Local Headlines: The Justice Department Reaches A Settlement

The Justice Department reached a settlement agreement with Service Oklahoma today to resolve its <u>findings</u> that the state agency violated the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) by maintaining a mobile application that is in accessible to individuals with vision disabilities.

Under the agreement, Service Oklahoma will ensure that any mobile app that it creates, administers, or maintains is accessible to individuals with disabilities and conforms to accessibility guidelines Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG), Version 2.1, Level AA. Service Oklahoma will take other corrective actions, including soliciting accessibility feedback and requests from the public, retaining an ADA coordinator, providing ADA training to employees, and reporting to the department. This agreement is part of the Civil Rights Division's Tech Equity Initiative to combat disability discrimination that occurs through technology, such as websites and mobile apps. You can transfer your house or other personal property to charity without changing your will or trust. By using a transfer on death deed, you may record (file) the deed with the local land records office before your death, but you are free to change your mind and revoke the deed at any time during your life. Upon death, it will go to charity.
