She was born with Moebius Syndrome, which causes hearing loss and facial paralysis. Julia started wearing hearing aids at age 6 months. As a result of her hearing loss her formal education started at age two. Julia was mainstreamed into elementary school and because of her early start was way ahead. Then

Middle School! This age is difficult for many but if your teachers are not supportive it is even more difficult. Julia was actually happy to have COVID come along so she could hide behind a mask and finish with virtual learning. Julia decided to just hurry through high school "with my head down" until she met that special teacher. She was the school Leadership teacher and she encouraged Julia to try out for a part in the

freshman school play. With her confidence bolstered and supported by a teacher who taught life Lessons and leadership skills Julia joined the drama department and participated in eleven plays thru high school. Julia discovered that her disability didn't matter. What is important in life is personality and life skills. Julia loves theater and while it is stressful she has learned good time management, how to work under pressure, and improved her people skills. All which will help her as she continues her education in college. She is no longer that timid middle schooler but a strong, confident young woman willing to take what the world throws at her.

Julia has been in several Advanced Placement classes in high school.

She has been busy with theater, leadership and activities but she has maintained a 4.0 GPA and is a member of the National Honor Society!

Julia says that growing up wearing hearing aids is no fun but is now amazed at how far the technology has come. She knows now that her disability is not a setback but a push forward to become her best self.

Julia will attend the University of Central Oklahoma and study Funeral Science.

# Surveying Oklahoma's Performing Arts Venues

Ever wondered what a snapshot looks like of Oklahoma's performing arts\* facilities regarding their assistive listening systems, as required by the ADA?

Now in partnership with the Center for Hearing Access, we will systematically list, review, summarize, and share information. This project will be similar to Loop Oregon. A survey of 50 of Oregon's largest meeting facilities about their provision of assistive listening systems as required by the ADA. (4 pages, pdf)

Congress passed the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act on December 19, 2019.

The SECURE Act includes many provisions designed to facilitate and enhance saving for retirement, but no longer allows non-spouse beneficiaries of IRAs to

take a distribution over their life expectancy. Instead, the new law requires the funds be paid out over a maximum period of 10 years. (Exceptions: minors and individuals who are within 10 years of the age of the IRA owner.) For those interested in providing support beyond the 10-year time frame and seeking to support charitable causes, a charitable remainder trust is the perfect answer. You can stretch the beneficiary payments over the life of the beneficiary and whatever is left in the trust at the end of their life will pass to the Community Foundation.
